

5-12th grade students are also able to take the survey. A survey link for students will be available in Powerschool (in upper right



Schedule Changes



To discuss your child's schedule, please make an appointment to meet with the Program Secretary before the end of the first week or submit a class change form signed by a parent.


Course Change Rules

- 1. Limited quantities of exploration classes and essential class requirements may necessitate a student to be moved into classes other than those they choose.
- 2. At the beginning of each quarter, we will allow a single switch of classes for academic reasons only. The academic reason should be listed on the Course Change Form.
- 3. If a class needs to be changed, the Course Change Form must be signed by a parent or guardian. No forms will be accepted without a parent signature.

Your Involvement Influences Student Academic Success



School Role

Identifies Eligible Children

A trained recruiter interviews families to find if
the children in the family could be eligible for
the situation. The recruiter completes a
Conficate of Eligibility (COE) for the family
to document their migratory moves. Once the
COE has been approved, these students become eligible
to receive Migrant Education Program services.



Uses Data to Identify Needs
School and district staff use data to help them determine how the Migrant Education
Program could support the needs of eligible migratory children.



Provides Academic Support

Migratory children remain eligible to receive academic and other support services for up to three years.

Engages Families



Schools and districts communicate important information and involve parents/guardians in program planning and evaluation.
