Students will design an award that reflects Elizabeth Peratrovich's (Tlingit) culture:

Tlingit Blanket Award:

Materials needed:

Felt blankets

Cut outs of Tlingit cultural clan figures: Raven and Eagle, known as Crow and Wolf

Pony beads

Yarn

Glass beads

Beading needles

Thread

Kindergarten-3rd Grade:

1. Teacher choose hook on first page of packet to introduce lesson
2. Students glue on Raven or Wolf cut outs and beads onto blanket

4th-6th Grade:

1. Teacher choose hook on first page of packet to introduce lesson
2. Students sew Raven or Wolf cut outs and beads onto blanket

7th-12th Grade:

1. Teacher choose hook on first page of packet to introduce lesson
 2. Sew glass beads into pattern of Raven or Wolf onto blanket
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Totem Pole Trophy:

Materials needed:

Play-dough

1 bar Ivory Soap per student

Carving tools

2X2X8 inch wooden blocks

Clay (ceramics)

Kiln

Kindergarten-3rd Grade:

1. Teacher choose hook on first page of packet to introduce lesson
2. Students sculpt totem pole out of play dough

4th-6th Grade:

1. Teacher choose hook on first page of packet to introduce lesson
2. Students sculpt ivory soap into totem poles with Tlingit cultural figures

7th-12th Grade: (Various activities possible depending on arts class)

1. Teacher choose hook on first page of packet to introduce lesson
2. Students sculpt totem poles out of clay to be fired in a kiln OR
3. Carve totem poles out of wooden blocks
