

WHAT WE DO

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY



GOALS

The primary goals of the Migrant Education Program are to ensure that all eligible students:

- Have supports targeted toward increasing academic achievement
- Reach challenging academic standards
- Graduate from high school

SUPPORT SERVICES

- Tutoring for students in need of additional academic support with a focus on middle and high school
- Back to School event for families, including technology support and school supplies as needed
- Reading/Math/Science family events
- Water Safety: swim lessons as needed
- Summer scholarships to attend educational summer camps or enrichment classes
- Academic enrichment activities during the school year, as needed
- Eligibility for free school meals

There are over 700 eligible migrant students. Students may be eligible for services if they meet the following criteria:

The student, up to age 20, has traveled alone or with a parent or guardian across school district boundaries within the past three years to engage in specific migrant-eligible activity, which includes subsistence or commercial fishing, clamming, crabbing, shrimping, berry-picking, and logging

AND

The family stayed outside the school district boundary for a total of at least 7 nights and 8 days, consecutive or nonconsecutive, in a calendar year, to engage in the migrant activity

AND

There is an economic reliance on the activity to meet basic household needs
