

**Results of the American College Test (ACT)
the Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT)
and Advanced Placement (AP) Exams**

2013-14 School Year

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report presents results of college entrance exams taken by the Fairbanks North Star Borough School District's 2014 graduating class as well as Advanced Placement exams taken by district students during the 2013-14 school year.

Notable Facts:

More than half (516 students) of the 816 graduates in the class of 2014 took either the American College Test (ACT) or the Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT) at least once during their high school career (373 participated in the ACT while 405 participated in the SAT). Participation in college entrance exams varies from school to school; Ben Eielson had the highest participation rates for 2012 graduates (83%). Across the district, 305 students participated in 557 Advanced Placement (AP) exams during the 2013-14 school year.

What is Being Measured:

ACT and SAT scores are measures of college readiness. Achievement on these exams is one measure of how well college-bound students are prepared for higher learning in core academic areas. Because students self-select themselves for college entrance exams, none of these test results are based upon a representative sample of district students. Advanced Placement exams assess college-level knowledge in particular subject areas. Students who pass their AP exam with a score of 3 or higher may be eligible to receive college credit.

What the Results Show:

District students' average scores are higher than the average scores for state and national comparison groups in all subjects and tests, with the exception of SAT Writing and Math. In recent years, general trends show an increase in test-taking rates and a decrease in average scores for the SAT and ACT. Rates of graduates taking the ACT or SAT were different relative to grade point average, income (as determined by whether or not a student qualifies for the free or reduced price meal program), gender, and race/ethnicity. Test-taking rate gaps between non-low income and low income after controlling for GPA decreased significantly in 2010-11 to 2013-14 versus 2006-07 to 2009-2010. The 305 students who participated in 557 AP exams earned a score of 3 or higher on 69% of those exams.

INTRODUCTION

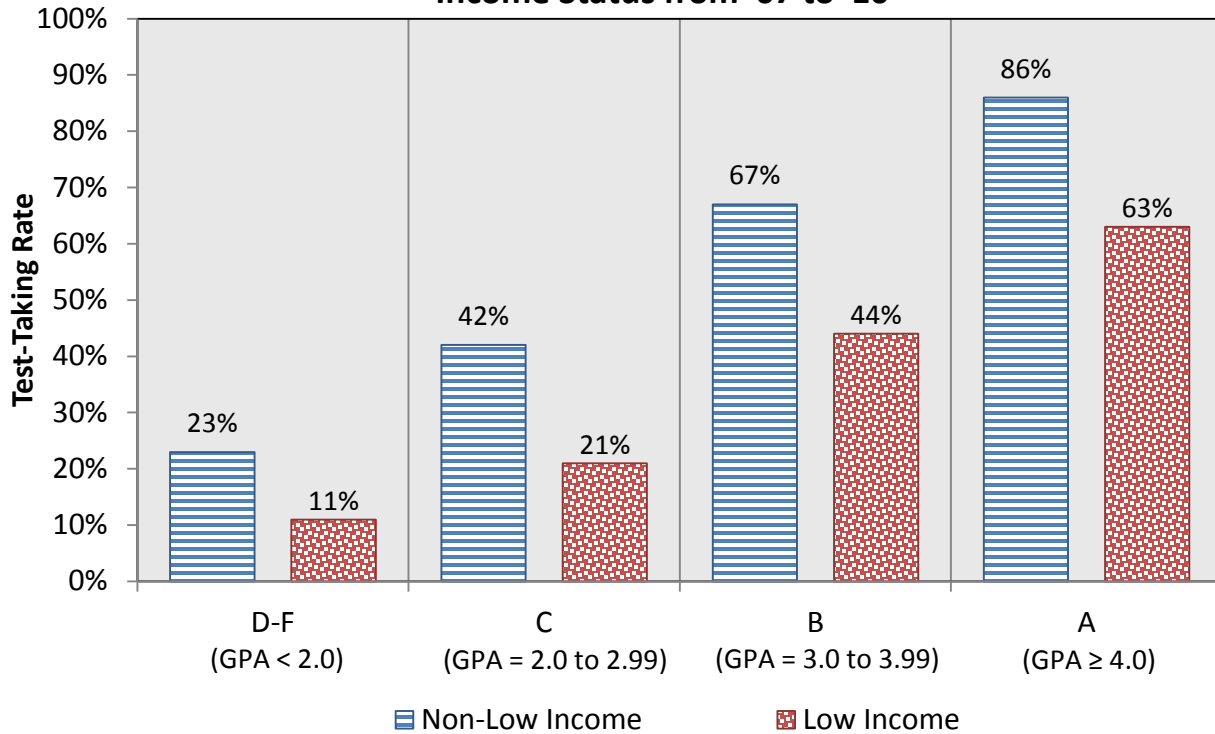
College-bound students nearing completion of high school often take college entrance examinations as part of the application process for post-secondary education. The two most widely used college entrance exams are the Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT) and the American College Test (ACT). This report presents results on each of these exams for the class of 2014, with comparative data from prior graduating classes.

Many colleges and universities offer credit for the successful completion of Advanced Placement (AP) exams taken while a student is in high school. The district offered a variety of AP courses last year at Ben Eielson, Fairbanks BEST, Hutchison, Lathrop, North Pole, and West Valley High School. Results from AP Exams taken by students in 2013-14 are included in this report, along with historical data. Additional longitudinal data by school, gender, and ethnicity can be found in the appendix.

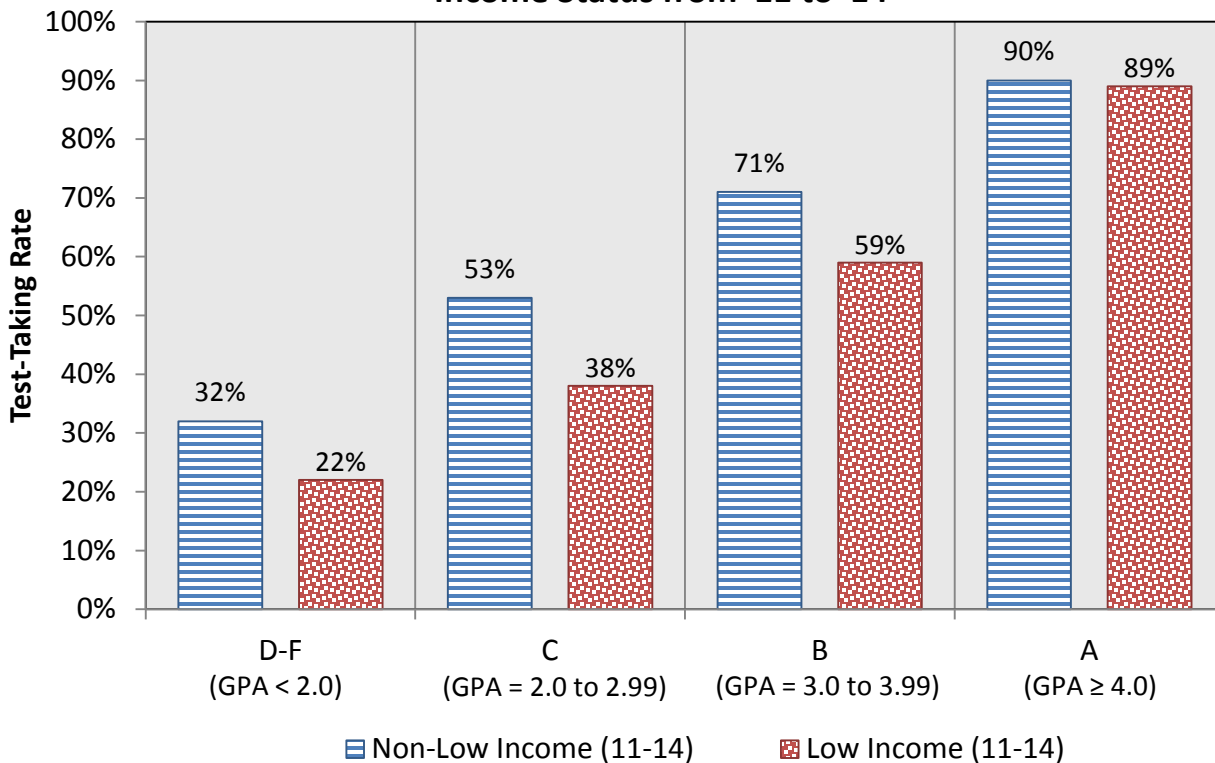
CHARACTERISTICS OF TEST-TAKERS

Of the 816 graduates in 2013-14, more than half (516 students) took either the ACT or the SAT at least once during their high school career (referred to as test-takers). However, the percentage of test-takers was different among graduates relative to gender, income, ethnicity, and grade point averages (GPAs). Among female graduates, 69% were test-takers, while 57% of male graduates were test-takers. Low income graduates had a test-taking rate of 43%, while non-low income graduates had a test-taking rate of 67%. Among graduates, test-taking rates for each race/ethnicity were: 66% of Caucasian, 46% of African American, 61% of Hispanic, 66% of Asian/Pacific Islander, 41% of Alaska Native/American Indian, and 74% of Two or More Races students. Graphs 1-2 exhibit test-taking rates over the four year time spans of 2006-07 to 2009-10 and 2010-11 to 2013-14 by income status and GPA groups (A = 4.0 to 5.0, B = 3.0 to 3.99, C = 2.0 to 2.99, D-F = 0.0 to 1.99). The test-taking gap between “similar GPA” low income and non-low income students in 2010-11 to 2013-14 was significantly smaller than the previous four years ('07 to '10). Further analysis investigated test-taking rates among racial/ethnic groups with similar income status and GPAs over four years (10-11 to 13-14). With the exception of Alaska Native/American Indian graduates, there were no statistically significant differences between racial/ethnic groups' rates of test-taking, when GPAs and income status were similar.

Graph 1: SAT/ACT Testing Rate by Grade Point Average and Income Status from '07 to '10



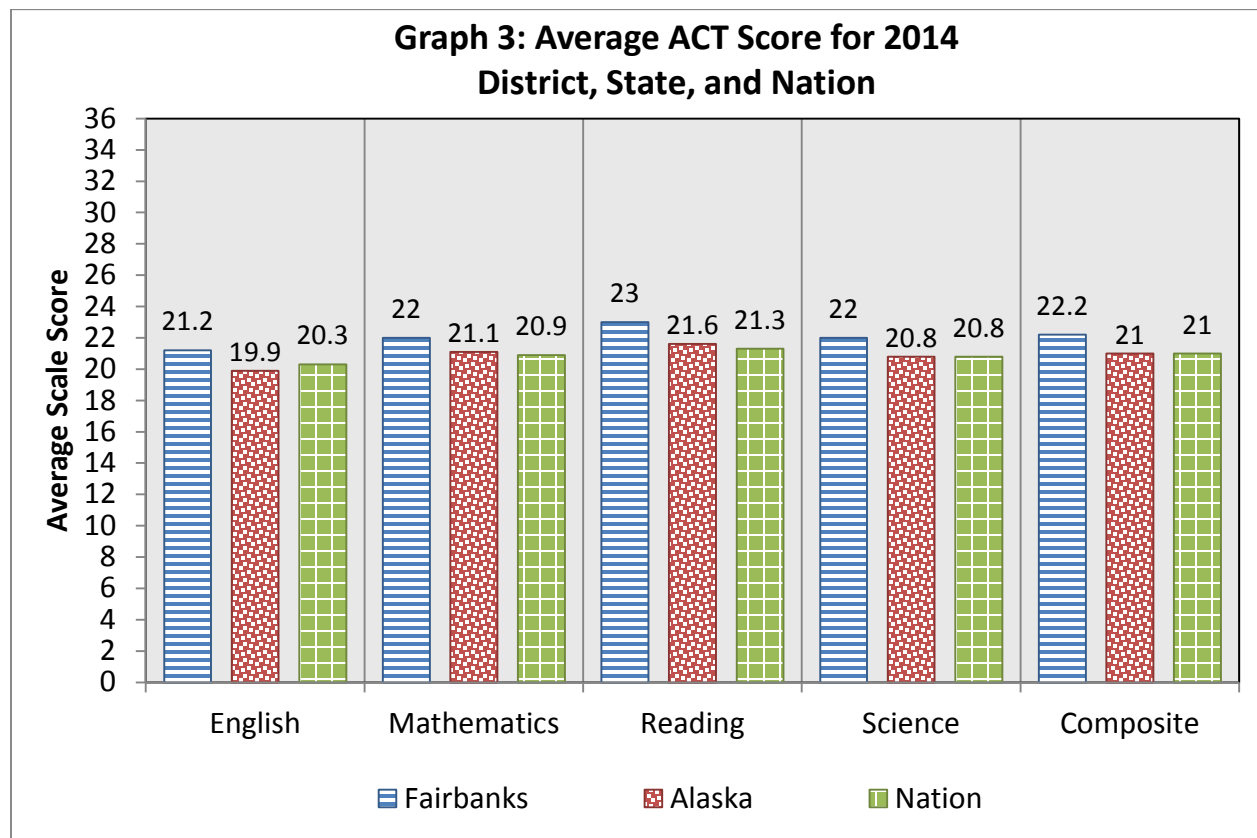
Graph 2: SAT/ACT Testing Rate by Grade Point Average and Income Status from '11 to '14



SECTION I: RESULTS FROM THE AMERICAN COLLEGE TEST

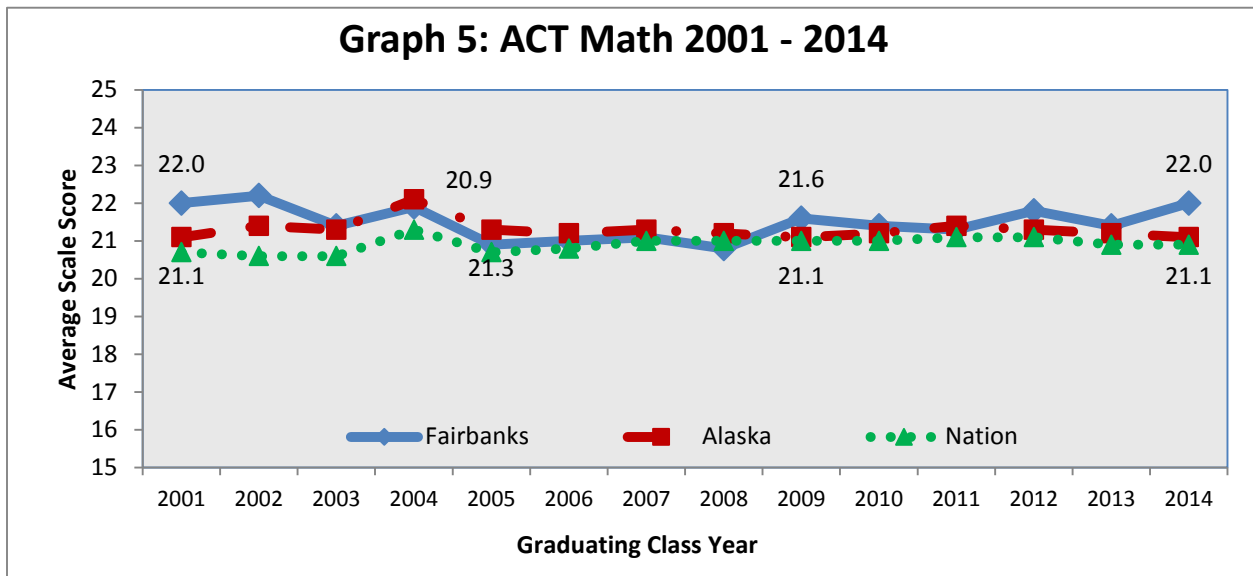
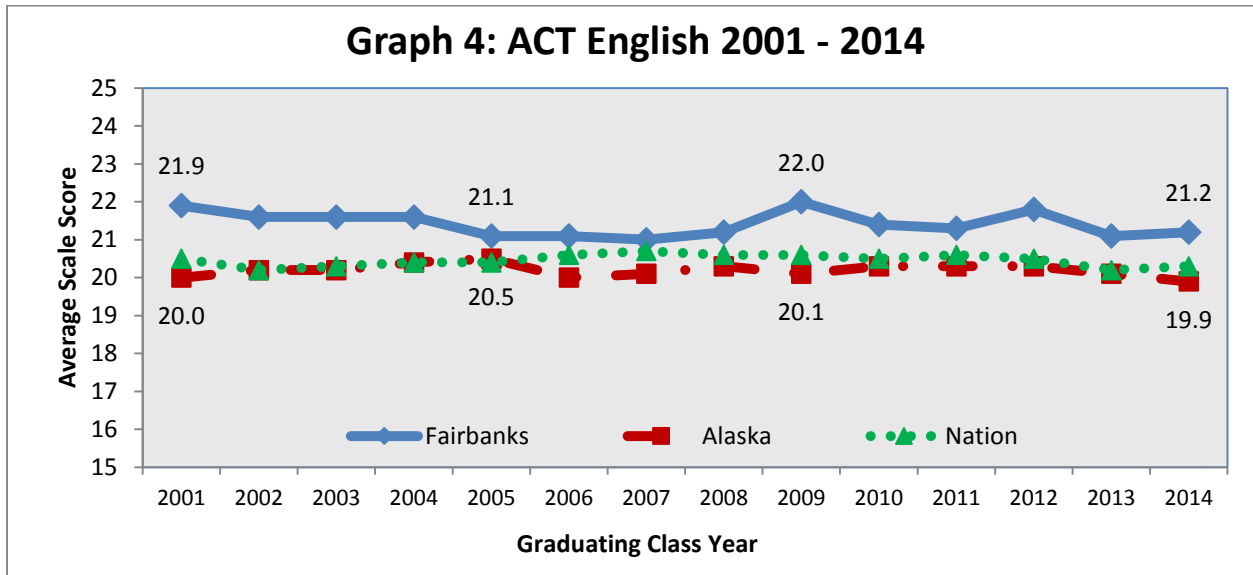
The ACT is a curriculum-based measure of college readiness. ACT regularly conducts a national curriculum survey to ensure that this assessment tool is accurately measuring both the skills taught in high school and the skills expected in entry-level college courses. The following section provides information about the performance of the district's 373 students who took the ACT as sophomores, juniors, or seniors and self-reported at the time of testing that they were scheduled to graduate in 2014.

Graph 3 shows the district's class of 2014 had higher average scores than both the state and national class of 2014. Fairbanks public school students earned an average composite score of 22.2; the composite score consists of English, Mathematics, Reading, and Science Reasoning (the range on the ACT is 1 - 36).

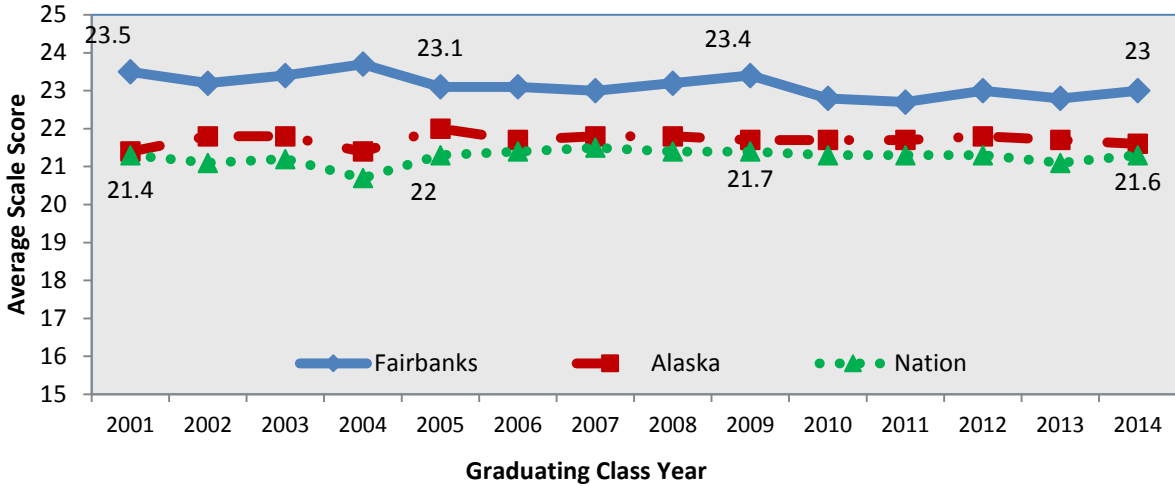


Subtest Trend Lines

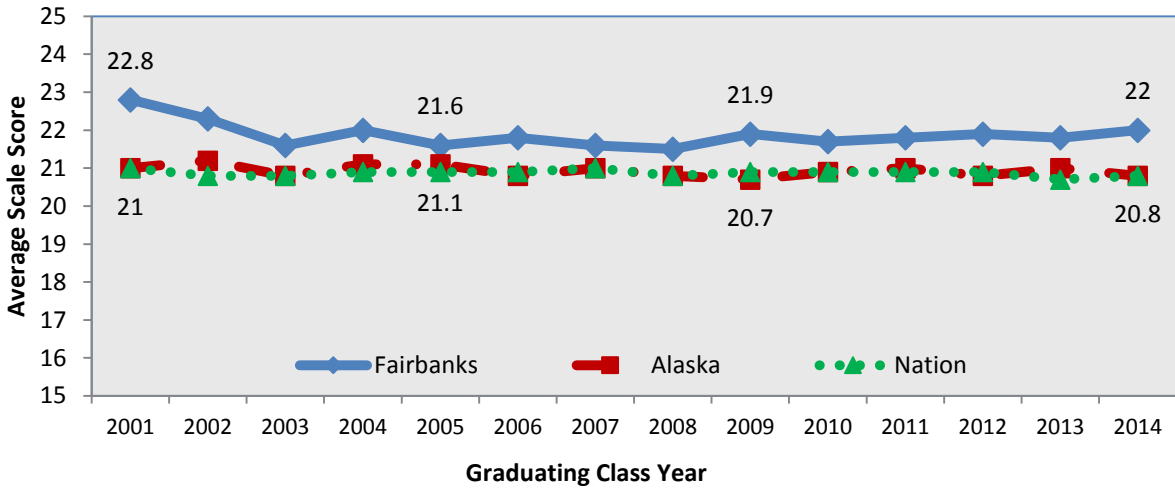
Each year, the graduating class data for schools, districts, states, and the nation represent a different cohort of students. Thus, year-to-year changes often represent normal expected fluctuations. Trend lines can provide more insight. Graphs 4-7 present the average district, state, and nation student scores on ACT subtests from 2001 through 2014.

Graph 7: ACT Science 2001 - 2014



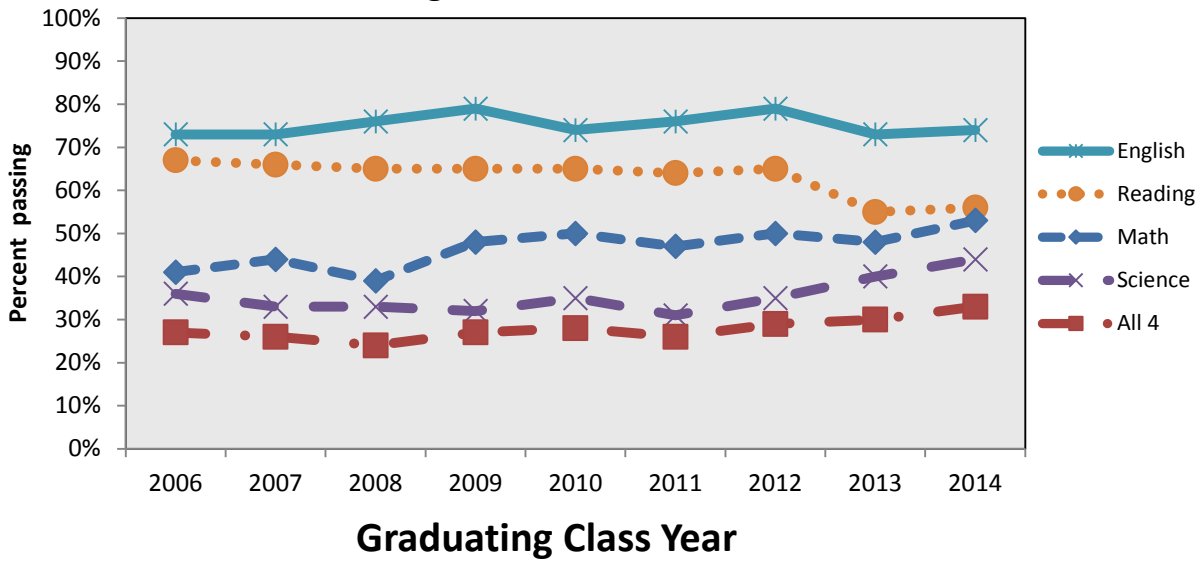
Benchmark Scores

ACT encourages educators to measure student performance in the context of college readiness measures, such as the percent of students meeting or exceeding ACT's College Readiness Benchmark Scores. A benchmark score is defined as the minimum score needed on an ACT subtest to indicate a 50% chance of obtaining a B or higher in the corresponding college course. College courses corresponding to each ACT subtest are College English Composition (English), Algebra (Math), Social Science (Reading), and Biology (Science). Table 1 presents the percent of students in the district, state, and nation who met these College Readiness Benchmarks on each subtest, for each of the graduating classes of the past nine years. Results indicate that the district's graduating classes consistently yield higher rates of college readiness than the graduating classes of the state and the nation. Graphs 10-11 show the rate of meeting ACT benchmarks from year to year for district or state graduating classes.

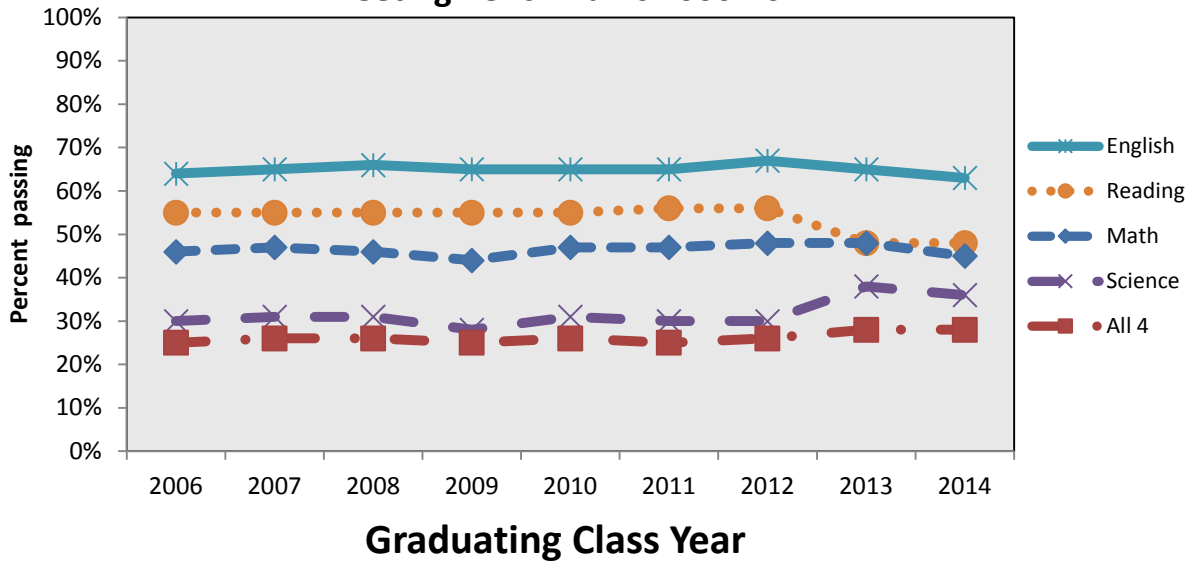

Graph 8: Percent of ACT-tested District students Meeting Benchmarks 2006-2014



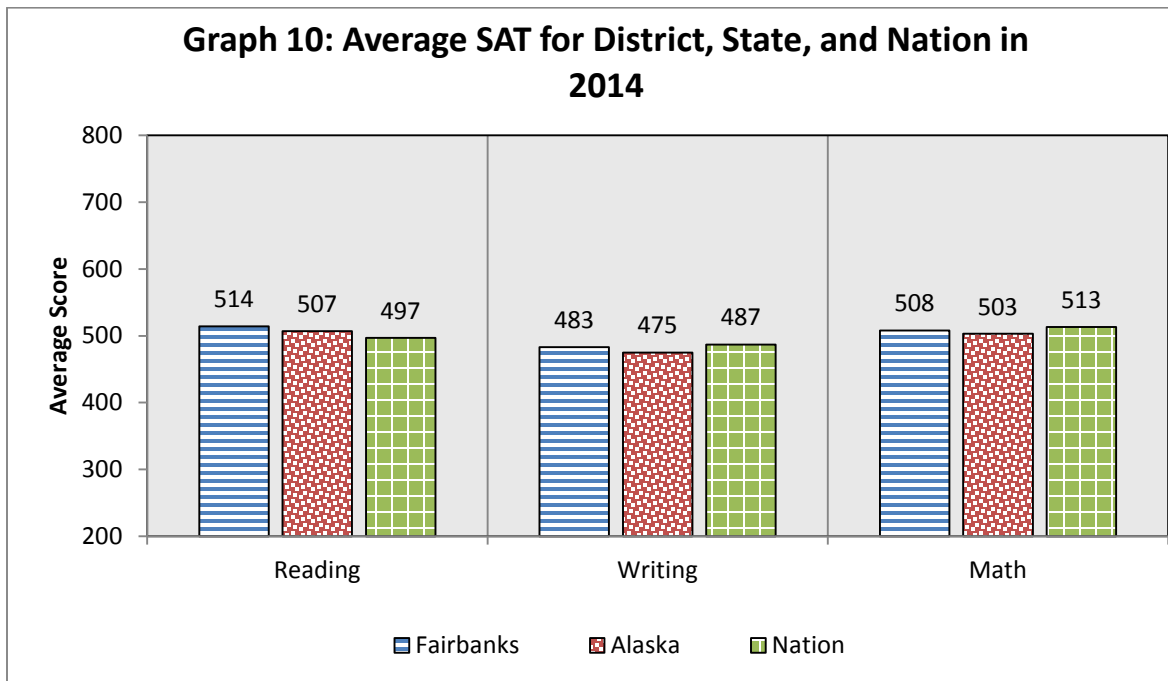
Graph 9: Percent of ACT-tested State students Meeting Benchmarks 2006-2014



SECTION II: RESULTS FROM THE SCHOLASTIC ASSESSMENT TEST

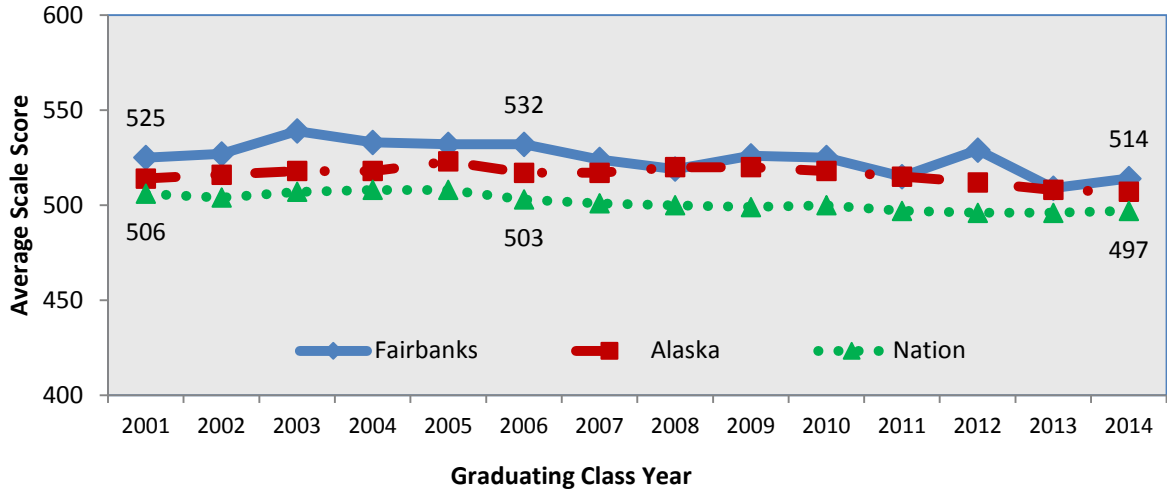
The Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT) is a widely used college entrance exam. Prior to 2006, it consisted of two sections measuring verbal skills and math skills. Scores for each section ranged from 200 to 800, for a total score ranging from 400 to 1600. Since 2006, the SAT has consisted of three sections measuring Reading, Writing, and Math skills yielding total scores ranging from 600 to 2400. More information regarding the SAT is available at www.collegeboard.com/newsat. The section which follows reports the results from the 405 district students who took the SAT as sophomores, juniors, or seniors and self-reported at the time of testing that they were scheduled to graduate in 2014. If a student took the test more than once, SAT reports their most recent score.

The average total score earned on the SAT by district students (1505) was 20 points higher than the average total score of students in Alaska (1485) and 8 points higher than the average total score of students nationally (1497). Graph 10 shows that 2014 graduates in the district had higher average scores than test-takers across the state in all subjects and the nation in Reading.

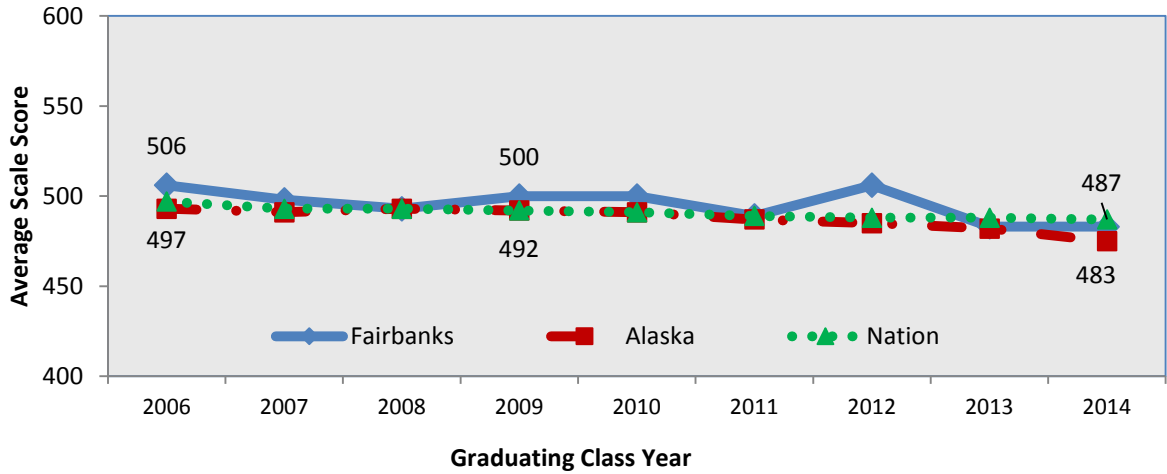


Longitudinal scores for district students on the Reading, Writing, and Math sections of the SAT appear in the graphs 11-13. Graph 12 contains less data, since 2006 was the first year of administration for the Writing section.

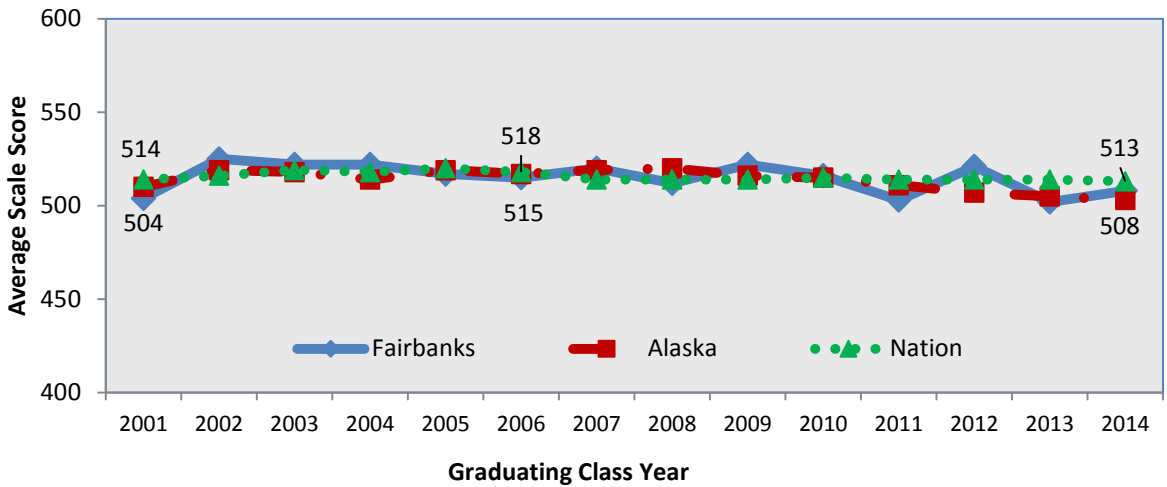
Graph 11: SAT Reading 2001 - 2014



Graph 12: SAT Writing 2006 - 2014

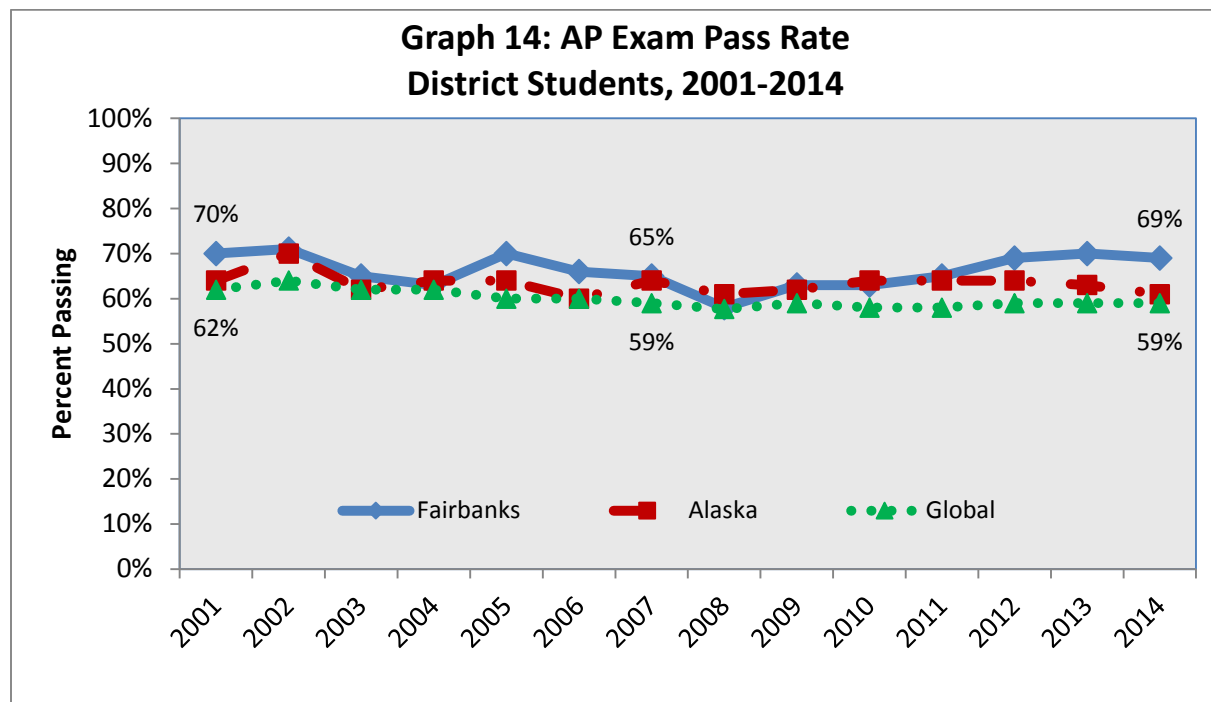


Graph 13: SAT Math 2001 - 2014

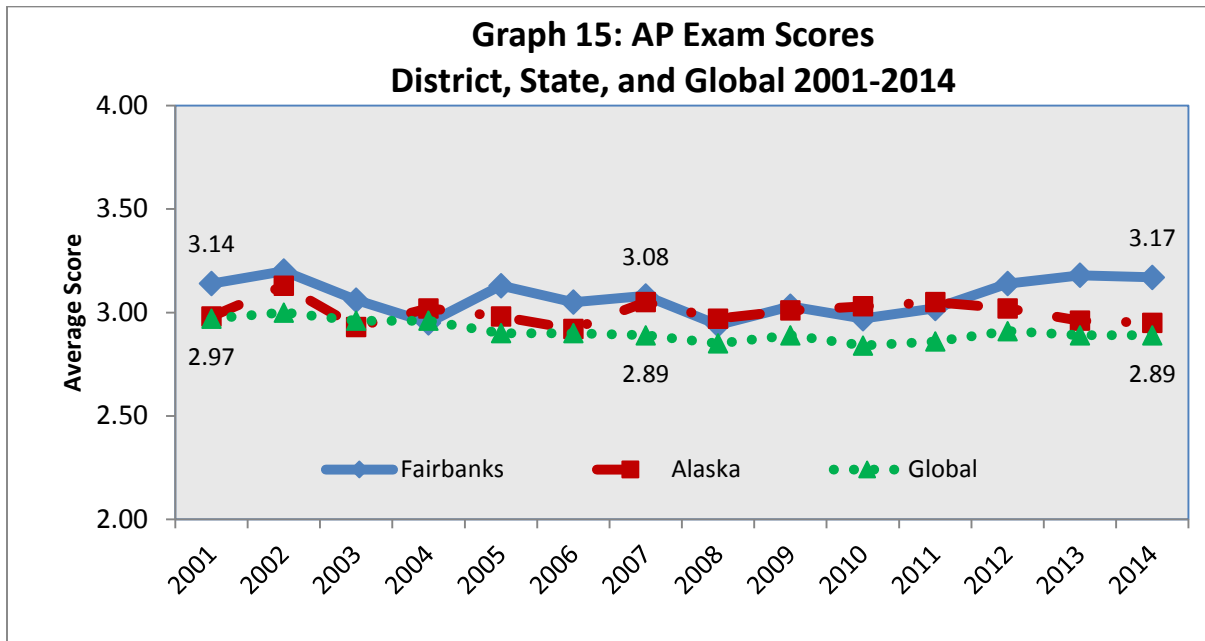


SECTION III: RESULTS FROM THE ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAMS

Advanced Placement (AP) exams assess college-level knowledge in particular subject areas. Students generally enroll in an advanced placement course in preparation for taking an AP exam, although taking an AP course is not a requirement for taking an AP exam. AP exams are graded on a scale of 1 (low) to 5 (high), with a score of 3 considered a passing grade. Students who pass their AP exam with a score of 3 or higher may be eligible to receive college credit in that subject area, depending on the admissions policies of the college. In 2014, 69% (383) of the 557 exams taken by district students received a score of 3 or higher. This local percent (69%) is higher than the percent passing for all exams taken globally (59%), and in Alaska (61%).



District students took 557 AP exams during the 2013-14 school year, receiving an average score of 3.17. Students across Alaska earned an average score of 2.95. AP exams taken by all students in 2013-14 show an average score of 2.89. Graph 15 presents average district scores on the AP exams for the past 14 years.



SECTION IV: INDIVIDUAL SCHOOL RESULTS

Participation in college entrance exams varied from school to school. As shown in Table 2, Ben Eielson had the highest participation rate among district schools.

CONCLUSION

To summarize the findings of this report, consider the following questions:

1. How did the district’s graduating class perform relative to the state and the nation?

The Fairbanks graduating class yielded similar or higher average results on the SAT, ACT, and AP exams than the graduating classes within the state and the nation.

2. How did the district’s graduating class perform over time?

In general, there was little variation in performance for district students over the past 14 years, with a decrease in performance in 2013-2014 for Reading and Writing scores for the SAT and ACT. Changes in the test-taking rate of college entrance exams can influence the average performance of test-takers (for example, increases in test-taking rates of low achievers will decrease average performance). Participation rates in ACT/SAT testing over five years are illustrated below:

Although the district's graduating classes generally perform well on the SAT and ACT exams, the results should be interpreted with caution. Students self-select themselves for college entrance exams. There may be high performing students who did not take these tests and low performing students who did. Due to this process of self-selection, SAT and ACT results should not be used to evaluate teacher, school, district, or program instruction. However, achievement on these exams is one measure of how well college-bound students are prepared for higher learning in important academic areas.

The rate of test-taking within subgroups provides more useful information. Female graduates had higher rates of test-taking than male graduates, non-low income graduates had higher rates of test-taking than low income graduates (even for students with similar GPAs), and Alaska Native/American Indian graduates had lower rates of test-taking than non-Alaska Native/American Indian graduates (even for students with similar GPAs and income status). In 2010-11 to 2013-2014, the gaps in test-taking rates were smaller than previous years for most student groups. In 2014-2015, test-taking rates are expected to increase considerably when participation in a college-or-career readiness assessment (ACT, SAT, or WorkKeys) is a part of high school graduation requirements.
