- 1. FNSBSD CTE course offerings /Pathways/Programs of Study examined
  - a. STA/ INTRO TO TRADES discussed by John Plutt / Wendell Whistler
    - i. Must meet same requirements as adult apprentices
    - ii. Start right out of High School
      - 1. Twenty high school students have started IBEW STA 13 are still in the program. Three students will be journeying out.
      - 2. Lessons learning
        - a. Educating students about what to expect
    - iii. Introduction to Trades essentially a 72 hour interview
      - 1. Shows up on time, ready to go
      - 2. Mentorship and coaching students to prepare for apprenticeship.
      - 3. Out of STA's only 1 is no longer an apprentice
      - 4. Equivalent of \$35-50,000 scholarship with \$19 wage.
  - 2. New program for high school seniors through the Electrical Training Alliance where they will receive a certificate for 1<sup>st</sup> year of training followed by two week course after graduation. Only 4 years of school instead of five left.

- 3. Multiple Graduation Pathways discussed. Align with UAF/CTC occupational endorsements, certificates, and associate degrees.
  - i. CNA's discussed by Andrea Gelvin
    - a. Course prepares them to take the state certification
    - b. Provides for foundation in Health Care careers
    - c. Avenue for patient contact hours
