Teacher's Biographies

Elementary School Teachers

Kendi Adams teaches band at University Park, Woodriver, and Anne Wien Elementary Schools. Kendi is from Idaho; she graduated from the University of Idaho after completing a BMUS degree in Music Education: instrumental/vocal. Go Vandals! She moved to Alaska the next year thinking she would teach in Alaska, have an adventure for a couple years and move back to the northwest lower 48. Well, eleven years later, she's still here. In addition to her band duties, Mrs. Adams also teaches an after school jazz band at both UPark and Woodriver. As for her own musical pursuits, Mrs. Adams enjoys collaborating with fellow music teachers and friends on various projects and is an active musician at her church. She is a member of the National Association for Music Education and the Alaska Music Educators Association.

Trevor Adams is a composer, violist, and music educator with a Bachelor's in music education and a Bachelor of Arts in music composition from the University of Alaska Fairbanks. Currently, he is the orchestra director at West Valley High School and teaches band, orchestra, and general musical at Two Rivers. During his time at UAF, he has played with The Fairbanks Symphony Orchestra, The Arctic Chamber Orchestra, The Northern Lights String Orchestra, Opera Fairbanks, and Fairbanks Light Opera Theater. In both the 2011- 2012 and 2014-2015 academic years, Trevor received the Most Outstanding Music Major Award from the College of Liberal Arts for his hard work and dedication to the program. He has taught at the UAF Summer Music Academy, the UAF String Fling, coached the North Star Strings, and conducted the FYO String Orchestra. He is a current member of the Nanook String Quartet which regularly gigs, performs for events, and gives concerts. In February, 2015, he put on a recital of his own compositions in which he conducted and performed in, and in May, 2015, his original score for The Muse was premiered at UAF's "Thaw Out Film Festival". Trevor has attended the 2013 American String Teachers Association National Conference in Providence, Rhode Island, the 2014 Fairbanks Suzuki Institute while taking the Violin/Viola Book 1 training course, and the 2012, 2014, and 2018 Alaska Music Educators Association Conferences. Recent projects include a recital of new compositions given in May of 2017 and a collaborative arts/science presentation at the American Geophysical Union Conference in New Orleans, LA. He is a member of the National Association for Music Education and the Alaska Music Educators Association.

Nathan Arnold was born and raised in Alaska. After graduating from Lathrop High School in 1995 he began studying classical guitar while working at the University of Alaska. In 2004 he left Fairbanks to study music education at the University of Idaho. After graduating he returned to Fairbanks in 2009 and accepted a position with the Fairbanks North Star Borough School District. He taught at Barnette Magnet School for three years before moving to North Pole Elementary, where he taught general music, guitar and choir for four years. He currently teaches general music, guitar and choir at Weller Elementary. In addition to general music, choir and current trends in music education, his classes offer students the opportunity to study the guitar and ukulele. His guitar students have performed with Orff Ensembles as well as Orchestras. Mr. Arnold is Level 1

Orff-Schulwerk certified. Mr. Arnold is a guitarist who has performed in a wide variety of styles and venues. From popular styles to classical and jazz, he has been an active participant in making music where he lives.

Nathan Arnold (continued) He teaches guitar at the annual UAF Summer Music Academy and also maintains an active private studio of students in the Fairbanks area, instructing a wide variety of students and styles. Each summer he instructs the Kids Music Camp for UAF Summer Sessions. He also serves as the Worship Director for Harvest Church. Mr. Arnold maintains active memberships in NAfME, AMEA, Alaska Orff Chapter and AOSA.

Katie Bates teaches orchestra at Midnight Sun, Ticasuk-Brown, and North Pole Elementary Schools. Katie began playing piano in the fourth grade and added violin between sixth and seventh grade. Violin was her primary instrument at St. Cloud State University. She has a B.S. in comprehensive Music Education from St. Cloud State University in Minnesota and a Master's in Education from Cambridge College in Massachusetts. Katie has taught for almost forty-four years (next spring it will be almost forty-five years), although it has not all been in the public schools. She has taught orchestra/strings, guitar, piano, general music, and she has taught some of the band instruments as well. Over the years, she has participated in community orchestras, pit orchestras, played in churches, and currently plays viola in the Northern Lights String Orchestra at the University of Alaska Fairbanks. Katie composes music for her students to play at their concerts. One of her sons is working on a DMA in Music Theory and Composition. Two of her former students are now teaching orchestral strings in this school district. She is a member of the National Association for Music Education and the Alaska Music Educators Association.

Melanie Bieniek teaches general music and choir at Ticasuk Brown Elementary School. Melanie is a product of the Fairbanks School District. She started playing the baritone in the fourth grade at Weller Elementary and then later the euphonium at Ryan and Lathrop. After graduating from high school, she attended the Conservatory of Music at the University of the Pacific in Stockton, CA. There she earned a Bachelor's of Music degree in Music Education. After graduation, she began teaching band and general music with the Linden Unified School District. During her time in California she continued playing her euphonium in Valley Concert Band, a professional concert band in the San Joaquin Valley. After her fourth year with the Linden School District, she returned to Fairbanks and has been teaching General Music at Ticasuk Brown since 2005. While teaching, she completed her Master's Degree in Curriculum (Arts Integration) through Lesley University in 2013. She currently plays in the Fairbanks Community Band and the University Wind Symphony. Melanie is a member of the National Association for Music Education, the Alaska State President for AAK, Board of Directors for FEA, FEA Teacher Rights Committee...and the list goes on! Awards Received: New Teacher of the Year, BP Teacher of Excellence, & AMEA Music Advocate of the Year.

Meta Bravos teaches general music at Anne Wien School. Meta was born in Chicago, Illinois. She began playing violin in 4th grade, and later switched to piano. Through her junior and senior years attending Sullivan High School, she was totally committed to participating in her choir program. After graduating from Sullivan, she attended Harper Junior College, and later, Adams State College, Colorado, graduating in 1976, earning her BMUS in organ performance, and an inspiration to study further in sacred music. Once home again in Chicago, she started the children's choir at her home church, St. Andrews, and later went back to school, DePaul University, to earn her teaching certification in music, completing her studies in 1982. Ms. Bravos moved to Alaska in October, 1982, and began her teaching career in Kake, Alaska in 1983. Since then, she has had the

pleasure to have taught and lived in the communities of Anchorage, Bethel, Nome, Willow and Fairbanks, as well as a year back in Illinois, with the North Boone Community School District 200, Poplar Grove, Illinois.

Meta Bravos (continued) In Fairbanks, Ms. Bravos sang with the Alaska Chamber Chorale for several years, while also participating on the Boards of Directors of Fairbanks Light Opera Theatre for three years, and Opera Fairbanks for nine years.

Craig Brennan teaches orchestra at Arctic Light and Ladd Elementary Schools. He is a first-year teacher from Snohomish, Washington. He received his degree in Music Education from Western Washington University in 2016. He has been playing trombone since 2002 as well as participating in a few marimba ensembles. Before attending Western Washington University, Craig spent two seasons in the Arizona State University Sun Devil Marching Band, where he had the opportunity to play as part of the halftime show at the 2011 Maaco Bowl in Las Vegas along with all home games during the regular season. His immediate family – mom, dad, and one sister (also a teacher), live in Washington.

Gwendolyn P. Brazier teaches general music at Barnette Magnet School as well as band and orchestra at North Pole High School. Gwendolyn began teaching for the Fairbanks North Star Borough School District in 2009, at Salcha Elementary School. Over the last several years she has added a Kindergarten violin program to each of her school's and a musical theater class at Barnette Magnet. She was the after school advisor for the West Valley High School Thespian Drama Troupe #628 from 2011 till 2017. She has stage or music directed for North Pole, Lathrop and West Valley High Schools. Her talents do not end in the classroom. Ms. Brazier is an avid Fairbanks arts community supporter and performer. She has performed as a bassist in the Fairbanks Symphony Orchestra, Northern Light String Orchestra, North Star Strings and Fairbanks Community Band. She performs as a percussionist with the Fairbanks Community Band and vocalist with the Community Jazz Band. Gwendolyn has been a featured guest soloist and regular choral member of Choir of the North, Alaska Camerata and directed the Madrigal Singers, FLOT Showcase and Rainbow Choir. She has directed and performed in numerous stage productions throughout the Fairbanks theater community, to include Fairbanks Drama Association, Fairbanks Light Opera Theatre, Fairbanks Shakespeare Theatre, UAF Theater and Film, Fairbanks Opera as well as the University of Alaska Student Drama Association. Currently, she is a founding member and board president for The Interior Independent Theatre and performs with a popular 70's funk band. Gwendolyn is a member of the National Association of Music Educators, American Choral Directors Association, American Band Directors Association and the Alaska chapter of the American Band Directors Association, Alaska Music Educators Association. She is the current treasurer for the Alaska Chapter of the American Choral Directors Association.

James Castleberry currently teachers band at Arctic Light and Ladd. James Castleberry was born in Jacksonville, FL. He spent his grade school years in Missoula, MT before moving back to Florida at the beginning of his seventh grade year. James discovered clarinet in 5th grade, adding saxophones in ninth grade and percussion in eleventh grade. During his senior year of high school he auditioned for the U.S. Army Band and was accepted. He enlisted in October of 1988 and spent the next twenty-one years performing for Soldiers and Civilians in fourteen different countries. James has performed with many American artists such as Blake Shelton, Wayne Newton, Chris Isaac, and Aaron Tippin, as well as local artists in America, Asia, and Europe. During his twenty-one years of service James completed his Bachelor's degree in History through University of Maryland and, following his retirement in 2009, he completed his teaching certification from the

University of Alaska. James was immediately hired to teach band and orchestra at Crawford and Salcha elementary schools and taught in the Fairbanks school district for the next three years.

James Castleberry (continued) After completing his Master's degree in Instructional Technology in 2013, James moved with his family to Bandon, Oregon where he taught Social Studies and Band at Coquille Jr-Sr High for two years before returning to Fairbanks in 2015. He currently teaches band at Woodriver Elementary and both band and orchestra at Crawford and Salcha Elementary schools. James enjoys performing occasionally with members of the Army Band, Alaska Blaskapelle, and other local musicians.

Sunnifa Deehr teaches at Weller, Pearl Creek and Joy Elementary Schools. She began violin with the first suzuki group in Fairbanks at the age of 5. After receiving a master's in landscape design, Sunnifa discovered that she had no real talent at that, so she decided to helped build a brewery (Silver Gulch) before going back to school for music education. Sunnifa has played and traveled extensively with the Arctic Chamber Orchestra and Fairbanks Symphony. She is a certified Suzuki instructor, with past experience conducting group lessons and teaching privately. Sunnifa has also been a conductor of the string orchestra (the youngest group of the Fairbanks Youth Orchestras). She spent 2 years teaching general music at Anderson before moving to Choir and Orchestra at Tanana Middle, as well as elementary orchestra at Joy and Nordale. She is a member of NAfME, ASTA and the Suzuki Association of the Americas.

Eileen Gillette teaches general music and orchestra at Nordale Elementary School. Eileen was born in Ft. Benning, Georgia and grew up as an Army brat. She began to play the flute in 6th grade and became involved in band and choir at Lathrop High School when her family moved to Fairbanks, Alaska. After high school, Eileen began her Music Education degree at the University of Alaska Fairbanks and completed it at Kansas University in 2007. After moving back to Alaska, she began working for the Fairbanks North Star Borough School District as an elementary band and orchestra teacher. Elementary School Music Data

Class Time:

In most buildings, elementary general music classes meet 2-3 times per week on a rotating schedule. These specialist service Pre-K through 6th grade students depending on each school's classroom needs. In addition, these teachers provide music instruction to special education students, both mainstreamed and self-contained. None of the charter schools in our district receive music instruction from a certified music educator. All other elementary schools receive instruction from highly qualified music professionals who have at least a bachelor's degree, full state certification, and have demonstrated competency in music. General music teachers are encouraged to coordinate several concerts a year in order to showcase student development, provide performance opportunities, and engage the community in musical activities.

Middle School Music Data

Class Time:

Music is offered at every traditional middle school in the FNSBSD. The three traditional middle schools in Fairbanks each have one full-time music director who teaches all the music classes offered at that site. In North Pole the position is split between two people. All of these schools offer choir, band, and orchestra in addition to any other classes such as jazz band, guitar, or enrichment classes. These professionals are responsible for choosing music for performances and for growing students' skills. For a middle school music director in the FNSBSD, there are several different classes for which to prepare. In fact, rarely is a class duplicated in their day, which equates to usually at least five different preps in a day. Middle school music classes are taught by highly qualified music professionals with at least a bachelor's degree in music education, full state certification, and has demonstrated competency in music by passing the Praxis II test.

State and National Music Awards

The existence of the ASAA/First National Bank Alaska All–State Music Festival enables outstanding high school musicians to participate as members of select statewide band, choral, and orchestral music ensembles and promotes the highest standards of musicianship. The goal of this activity is to foster and inspire technical achievement, aesthetic understanding, and critical listening skills that allow for the culmination of a final creative musical performance of the highest artistic level.

Adopted by the All-State Music Festival Committee on February 10, 1996

Fairbanks has significant representation at the ASAA All-State Music Festival and the ASAA State Solo/Ensemble Festival. At the highly competitive 2018 ASAA All-State Music Festival, Region 6 (Delta, Fairbanks, and North Pole) submitted 82 auditions of which 37 were accepted. This equates to a 45% acceptance rate.

Five of the First Chair Awards at All-State were given to our students, which is 14.7% of first chairs awarded.

ASAA State Solo/Ensemble

The goal of State Solo/Ensemble is to foster and inspire technical achievement, aesthetic understanding, and critical listening skills. Students prequalify for participation by receiving a "I" or "Superior" rating at a qualifying regional festival. The students below received a "Superior" rating at the local regional festival and therefore qualified to participate in the ASAA State Solo/Ensemble Festival in Anchorage in 2018.

At the 2018 State Solo/Ensemble Festival, the FNSBSD was well-represented with 16 out of 43 command performances awarded to district students, which is 37% of the total command performances. By contrast, Anchorage School District had 12 command performances, and the Kenai Peninsula Borough and Mat-Su Borough School Districts each had 6. In addition, Fairbanks had 9 other 2nd or 3rd place nominations for command performances.

Noteworthy

Elementary:

All traditional elementary school students receive general music classes twice per week.

Non-charter elementary school students, regardless of socioeconomic status, in the FNSBSD have the opportunity to learn to play a musical instrument in 4th, 5th, and 6th grade by participating in band or orchestra.

Students have performance opportunities as part of school ensembles. Student performances create positive school culture and engage the community in school activities. These performances provide for personalized learning and group cooperation and collaboration.

Some elementary schools offer choir in grades 3-6.

Woodriver, University Park, and Ladd Elementary Schools offer jazz band for students in grades 4-6. These are mostly offered as co-curricular activities.

Students are given access to instrumental music instruction during the school day making it equitable for all students. This is possible because the FNSBSD provides instruments and equipment for student use.

The receipt of the anonymous \$110,000 donation for elementary musical instruments will help facilitate our districts' instrumental repair and replacement program. This year elementary school instrumental programs purchased dozens of new instruments for student use. Music teachers worked with procurement specialists to customize instruments according to the needs of each school. Because so many instruments were bought at once, the district was able to get great prices on good-quality instruments.

Fairbanks elementary band directors collaborated to rent UAF's Patty Center to put on the first ever Young Band Festival in the Interior. Over 300 students came together to put on this concert where all students played the same pieces together. There was great feedback from parents and supporters, and hopefully this will be the first of many more similar (and improved) festivals to come.

Middle School:

As students move from elementary to middle school, they have an automatic positive peer group through their band, choir and orchestra ensemble participation that will stay with them throughout their school career.

These positive peer groups also provide a place for military students to find a home at their new schools.

High School

Fairbanks had significant representation at the ASAA All-State Festival and ASAA State Solo and Ensemble Festival. At the highly competitive 2017 ASAA All-State Festival Competition, 53 Students of the 344 total participants were from the FNSBSD. This equates to 15% of the participants from the entire state were from our community.

Five of the First Chair awards at All-State were given to our students, which is 13% of first chairs given.

At the 2017 State Solo and Ensemble the FNSBSD was equally well-represented with 12 out of 28 first place command performance awards given to FNSBSD students, which is 43% of the total first place awards given.

North Pole High School produces a large-scale musical every year. North Pole High students and teachers produced and performed Hairspray: the Musical. West Valley students helped by playing in the pit orchestra, and Mr. Clooten directed the music. The show was a great success with the largest audience attendance in recent North Pole High history.

Lathrop High School puts on a large-scale musical every year or two. This year, Lathrop students and teachers produced and performed Disney's Newsies, which was a huge success. 37 students and 7 adults were in the cast. 22 were in the pit orchestra musicians, and there were 16 crew members. These musical endeavors have grown over the past 10 years. Initially they started with about \$2000.00 of seed money and now have grown that to over \$35,000.00 in profits from shows. This year they had over 8000+ people see the show. Pretty amazing!!

Miscellaneous:

All middle schools and high schools offer band, choir, and orchestra. This is very important in creating opportunity and equity among schools.

Teachers in the FNSBSD collaborate to produce Music In Our School Month Concerts which encompass students from grades 4-12.

All music teachers in the FNSBSD are highly qualified in music.

Music teachers from the FNSBSD are members of the Alaska Music Educators Association and attend many state and national conferences.

Area jazz band directors are collaborating on the second ever Jazz Nite held at Ryan Middle School on April 19th. This will feature all school jazz bands in the area from elementary up to high school. This is an opportunity for students to play for their families, community members, and other students. It gives younger students the chance to hear the kind of musicians they can become if they continue playing jazz into middle and high school. For older students it's the opportunity to hear how far they've come and to hear what other groups around the borough are playing.

Collaboration occurs with other community groups such as Fairbanks Light Opera Theatre, Fairbanks Symphony Orchestra, UAF Department of Music and Fairbanks Concert Association. Many groups come and perform at schools and/or come to schools to work with students in order to improve their skills.

The music teachers of the FNSBSD sponsor a Music in Our Schools Month T-shirt design contest for their t-shirt fundraiser every year. The funds are used to give scholarships to music students to attend music/performance summer camps. In 2018, the MIOSM Scholarship Committee awarded \$2025 in scholarships to local students so that they could have musical experience and training over the summer! The following students received

awards in varying amounts: Joshua Swank, Burnley Garron, Juliana Nudi, Dominic Keller, Devon Sackinger, Ayla Rodgers, Torleif Bentzen, Olivia Cook, Kate Douge, Sophie Henry, Audrey Swank, Jonathan Swank, Reagan McNearney, Ian Carlson, Ella Carlson, Samantha Hopkins, Rudy Tansy, Adeline Hiemstra, and Hailey Smith. Their camps of choice included Alaska Cello Intensive, Fairbanks Bluegrass Camp for Kids, Flot Jr. Summer Fine Arts Camp, Dance Theatre Fairbanks Summer Dance Camp, UAF Summer Music Academy, Fairbanks Suzuki Institute, and Fairbanks Summer Arts Festival.

The district has been including music teachers in conversations about schedules and assignment changes. We look forward to continued conversations in this positive manner in the upcoming school year and beyond. This will ensure that our students receive an equitable and excellent music education in all our schools.

The FNSBSD has not proposed any cuts to overall district music staffing allocations!

Recommendations

Equitable Access to Music Education

Create a district music plan that provides guidance for all schools (charter, magnet, public) on the necessary curriculum and classes students must have access to as a part of an equitable, excellent, and well-rounded education. This aligns with the FNSBSD's motto "equity and excellence for all". It also aligns with the Fairbanks School Board's core value to be student centered.

Sustainable Staffing Options

In light of current budget concerns, we would encourage the district to look at a variety of staffing models to ensure that our students receive an equitable and excellent music education. Flexible staffing and sharing staff among various buildings/levels should allow teachers to best serve our students. Full time teaching positions will help recruit and keep high quality teachers for our district. This aligns with the Fairbanks School Board's core values to be collaborative and innovative as well as its strategic goals to execute effective communication and provide organizational support.

Principals who share itinerant staff should work collaboratively to maximize the use of time and resources.

In many situations, elementary instrumental music educators are not allowed to teach because of the needs of the school schedule. Currently it is up to the music teachers to reconcile these issues to the best of their ability. This aligns with the Fairbanks School Board's core values to be <u>collaborative</u> and <u>innovative</u> as well as its strategic goals to execute <u>effective communication</u> and provide <u>organizational support</u>.

District-Wide Music Hiring Committee

Under the guidance of a Music Coordinator, we recommend assembling a committee to assist in interviewing and hiring quality music teachers. This aligns with the Fairbanks School Board's core values to be <u>collaborative</u> and <u>innovative</u> as well as its strategic goals to execute <u>effective communication</u> and provide <u>organizational</u> support.

Jazz Band

Offer jazz band as a class at every middle school. This aligns with the FNSBSD's motto "equity and excellence for all". It also aligns with the Fairbanks School Board's core value to be student centered.

- This can be achieved by offering jazz band as a zero-hour class or during an advisory-type or exploratory-type class.
- Currently jazz band is not offered at all middle schools. It is, however, offered at all high schools.
- Because jazz band is an advanced class and requires critical thinking and another level of understanding in music, this discrepancy puts some students at a severe disadvantage to others when they go on to high school. Students who attend middle schools that offer jazz band are better prepared for this advanced ensemble, while students who attend a middle school that does not offer jazz band as a class have much less skill preparation for this.
- Offering jazz band as a class at every middle school would align more closely with the FNSBSD's goal to be equitable.

More Flexible Elective Options in Middle School

In most middle schools in our district, students and parents are forced to choose only one elective option. This creates conflict for opportunities for those same students to also participate in things like ELP. We would like to see more middle schools have either 1) students be able to choose more than one elective per year/semester or 2) students have more flexibility so that they can do band/orchestra/choir and ELP (for example) rather than have to choose one over the other because both are important for preparation to future successes. We see a huge drop in numbers from elementary school to high school -- from 38% participation in middle school to 19% in high school! We think offering more elective solutions and flexibility may help students who start in music to continue participating in music throughout their educational career.. This aligns with the Fairbanks School Board's core values to be <u>student-centered</u> and <u>innovative</u> as well as its strategic goals to provide <u>organizational support</u>.

Upgrade Technology in All Music Classrooms

There are music classrooms that have not been kept up with current technology within the district. *This aligns with the Fairbanks School Board's strategic goals to provide technology integration.*

Strategic instrument Repair/Replacement

Create a strategic plan of capital outlay on a rotational basis for the repair and replacement of aging instrument and/or equipment that may require expensive repairs or are beyond repair. Instruments have a life-span. At some point they are beyond repair or at least beyond inexpensive repair. Instruments that are broken or difficult to play are very discouraging for students. This aligns with the Fairbanks School Board's core values to be <u>student-centered</u> and <u>innovative</u> as well as its strategic goals to provide <u>organizational support</u>.

Topics for future consideration in reports:

- Surveying students to gain information such as
 - Why the decline in music participation from middle school to high school? Is it scheduling conflicts? Is it that students only get one elective?
 - What keeps students participating in music?
 - When and why do students cease to participate in music in school?
- Gathering further data from schools and breaking down that information to gain further knowledge.
- Getting numbers for elementary schools broken down by grades so that we can have accurate percentages in participation among grades rather than total school population.
- Collecting information about graduation rates and their correlations to participation in music.
- Gathering more information about music students who receive scholarships for continuing education.
- Budget considerations both district-wide and site-based.
- More specific k-8 data regarding participation in a variety of music classes.
- Collecting numbers for elementary instrumental music participation with accurate grade-level population. That way we can know the percentages of elementary students participating in instrumental music in schools.
