GRANT PROGRAM GOAL: The purpose of this program is to:

- (1) improve educational services for children and youth in State institutions for neglected or delinquent children and youth so that such children and youth have the opportunity to meet the same challenging State academic content standards and challenging State student academic achievement standards that all children in the State are expected to
- (2) provide such children and youth with the services needed to make a successful transition from institutionalization to further schooling or employment; and
- (3) prevent at-risk youth from dropping out of school, and to provide dropouts, and children and youth returning from correctional facilities or institutions for neglected or delinquent children and youth, with a support system to ensure their continued education.

POPULATION TO BE SERVED: Youth in the Fairbanks Youth Facility (FYF) entering local schools.

PROPOSED ACTIVITIES AT SUBMISSION: Funds will be used to partially fund a teacher aide to assist students who need extra assistance in reading and to support transitional services for students exiting the FYF program.

This year's NCLB consolidated application contains our district performance targets, action plans, responsibilities and NCLB program budgets. Each NCLB program budget is developed with an eye to supporting the overall NCLB action plans. The district's complete application will be available in the district grants office. The following is a summary of each program's activities and proposed budget for the 2008-2009 school year:

Title I – Improving the Academic Achievement of the Disadvantaged

- Part A, Education for the Disadvantaged-FY'09 allocation is \$3,123,602. Provides funds for supplemental academic assistance to schools with high numbers of students in poverty: Anderson, Anne Hopkins Wien, Arctic Light, Denali, Hunter, Salcha and Two Rivers. This assistance is distributed according to the number of students in poverty in the school and is used to buy additional teachers, tutors, materials, professional development and parental involvement activities. Some funds are set aside for district management of the program, paraprofessional training, translation of documents, and participating private school services.
- Part C, Migrant Education-FY'09 allocation is \$214,241. Provides tutoring and academic material and enrichment support for migrant youth.

Title II - Preparing, Training and Recruiting High Quality Teachers and Principals

- Title II Part A, Teacher and Principal Training and Recruiting Fund-FY'09 allocation is \$1,396,804. Funds will be used to deliver high quality, scientifically-based professional development to our teachers and administrators through workshops, classes, and mentoring. Mentoring provides professional development in school, in classrooms, and at district and school professional development days. This year Title II-A will fund Technology Teachers to mentor teachers in the integration of technology into instruction (5.5 positions). In addition, Title II-A will fund 0.5 of the dropout prevention coordinator, support for curriculum, and teaching positions to reduce class size.
- Title II Part D, Enhancing Education Through Technology-FY'09 allocation is \$52,427. Allocates funds for professional development in technology use (at least 25% must be spent in this area) and for equipment. Funds will be used for a .5 FTE integration of instructional technology teacher. Half of the State's Part D allocation is distributed to districts through a formula, and half the allocation is applied for on a competitive basis through grants (Enhancing Education Through Technology).

Title III-A Grant for English Language Acquisition, and Language Enhancement -FY'09 allocation is \$24,281. Funds will be used for language tests, staff to administer tests to Limited English Proficient students, teaching supplies, and drop-out prevention.

Title IV-A-Safe and Drug Free Schools and Communities (S&DFS&C)-FY'09 allocation is \$97,684 These monies are used for part of the salary of our S&DFS&C coordinator and prevention education. The district's S&DFS&C program is supported by other grants and district funds.

Title X – Repeals, Redesignations, and Amendments to Other Statutes-Part C, Education for Homeless Children and Youths, \$0. The district receives no specific funds for this program but is allowed to spend some Title I, Part A funds to accomplish this program's mandates. We budget for a full-time liaison to identify homeless youth and ensure they receive educational services as required by law, and to purchase supplies to assist youth in transition to stay in school.

Operation for small schools within the facilities is usually handled by the local education agency (LEA) in the community. The State allows the LEA to include the incarcerated youth in student counts for foundation funding, plus gives the district grant funds for the excess costs of educating youth within a lock-up facility. Some examples of excess costs are those associated with small class size due to space limitations and safety considerations, establishing individualized education plans for all students due to varied entry/exit dates, and running a year-round school program.

POPULATION TO BE SERVED: Youth incarcerated in the Fairbanks Youth Facility.
