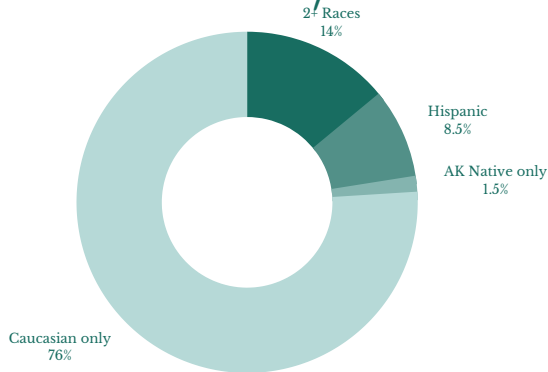

What a year this has been! Watershed, like every other school in the nation, is currently adjusting to this new paradigm of education during the COVID-19 pandemic. Although we are certainly disappointed to cancel traditional rites of passage that are held every spring, we still have three quarters of a successful school year spent together to reflect upon and appreciate.

- Watershed students continued to engage in the activities and experiences for which we are known - exploring their environment (often on skis), learning about the natural and cultural history of their place (through place-based instruction), and engaging with the community (through partnerships with local organizations and experts).
- Professional development focused on special education inclusion and aligning Watershed's science curriculum with the new Alaska Science Standards.
- Watershed's Academic Policy Committee (APC) passed a schoolwide homework policy, revised the parent-student handbook, and explored the option of switching from a head teacher to principal model of school leadership.
- Watershed continues to enjoy a strong partnership with its PTSA and student council who host a variety of school community events.
